At 12:30 p. m. you will depart the White House by motorcade arriving at the 24th Street Extension Entrance of the Sheraton Park Hotel at approximately 12:40 p. m. PRESIDENT'S SCENARIO:

At 8:55 p. m. you will depart the Statler Hilton Hotel by motorcade arriving at the 24th Street Extension Entrance of the Sheraton Park Hotel at approximately 9:03 p. m. You will be escorted to a room immediately adjacent to the Sheraton Hall where you will be met by William C. Doyle, National Commander of the American Legion, and James C. Watkins, National Public Relations Director of the American Legion.


